Children's Corner (</pacific-climate-change-centre/childrens-corner>)





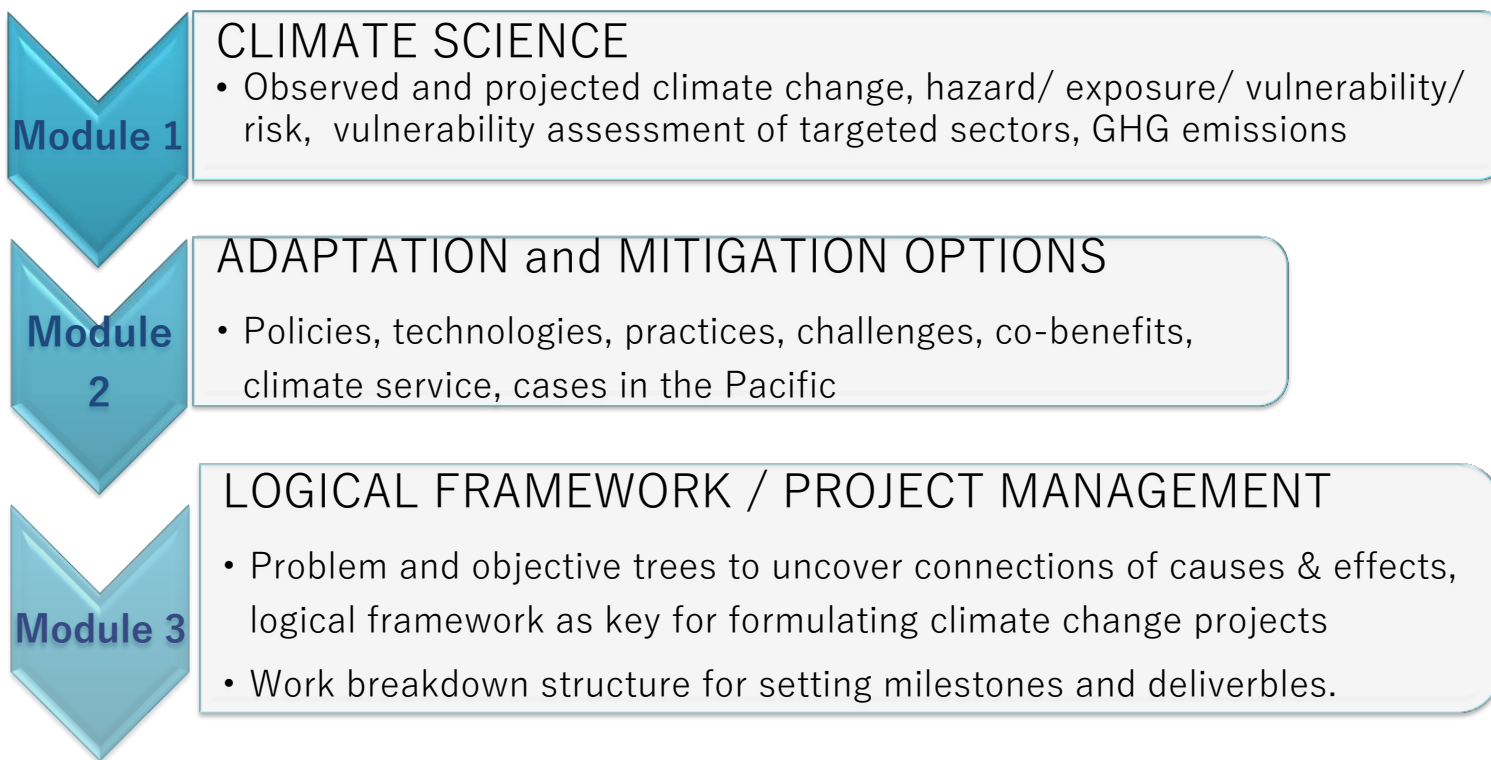
Project for Capacity Building on Climate Resilience in the Pacific

- The project aim to support the operationalization of the capacity building and training functions of the PCCC.
- The project will implement 12 training on adaptation, mitigation and access to climate finance for the Pacific Countries and Territories and Timor-Leste.
- Project period is 3.5 years (July 2019 – January 2023).
- Invitations are sent to National Climate Change Focal Points and requested to nominate participants.
- The Project Formulation Handbook is under development to further support the facilitation of project formulation in countries.

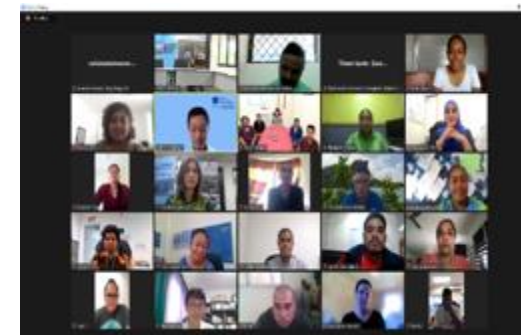

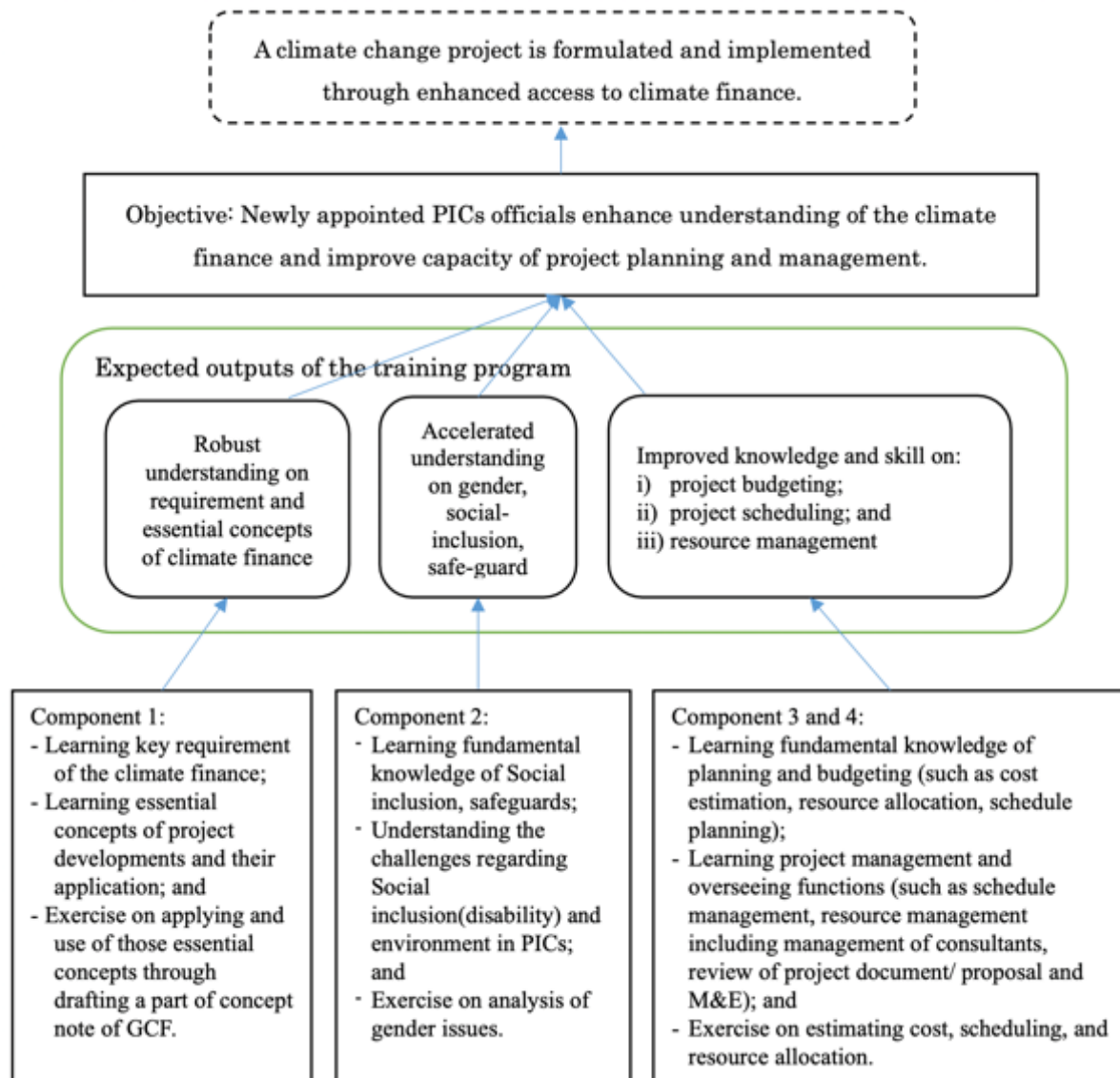

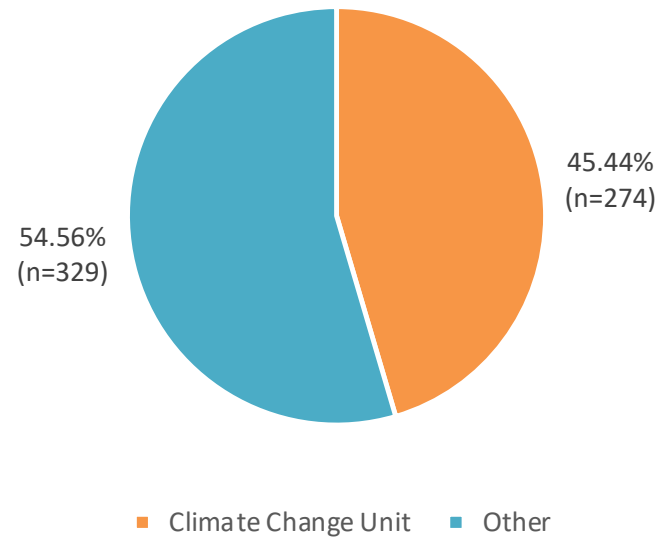
Number of participants by Department/Gender

- As of July 2022, 603 participants have participated in CBCRP-PCCC training

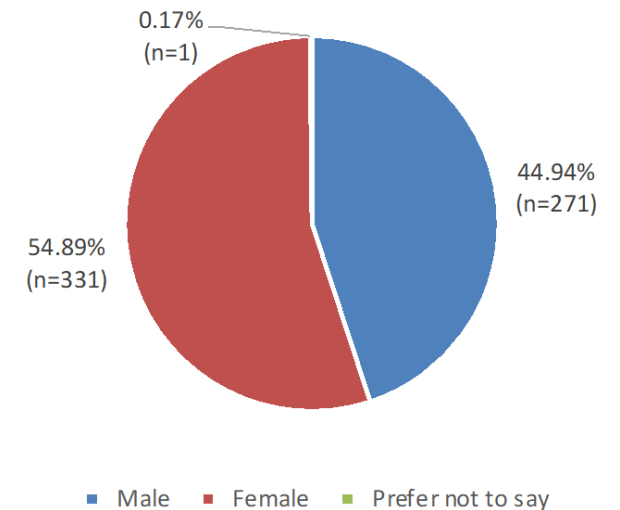
Target participants

Outcomes of the training programs

Capacity Enhancement:

- Participants have recognized new, different and additional knowledge and information for developing and implementing projects and activities.
- More than 75% of responded ex-participants of 6th months post-training questionnaires have utilized their training outcomes after training, including refinement of logical frameworks for project development.

Operationalization of the PCCC's function

- Learning opportunities for over 600 practitioners
- E-learning platform in service

Content

- Exercises: opportunity to discuss with different stakeholders, explore ideas, purpose and challenges, and project concept development.
